Sophomores and Juniors – The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) will be given on **October 13.** This very important test is used to determine the semifinalists in the National Merit Scholarship, National Achievement, and National Hispanic Competitions. Only Juniors taking the test will be entered in the NMSQT competition, but the experience for Sophomores will be very advantageous when they take the test as Juniors and are entered in the NMSQT. The National Merit, National Achievement and National Hispanic awards are the most prestigious academic awards given to high school students. The PSAT/NMSQT is a short version of the SAT and is a very good predictor of how a student will score on the SAT. Students are encouraged to take the PSAT/NMSQT by paying the \$15 fee to their English teacher by **Friday, September 17.**
